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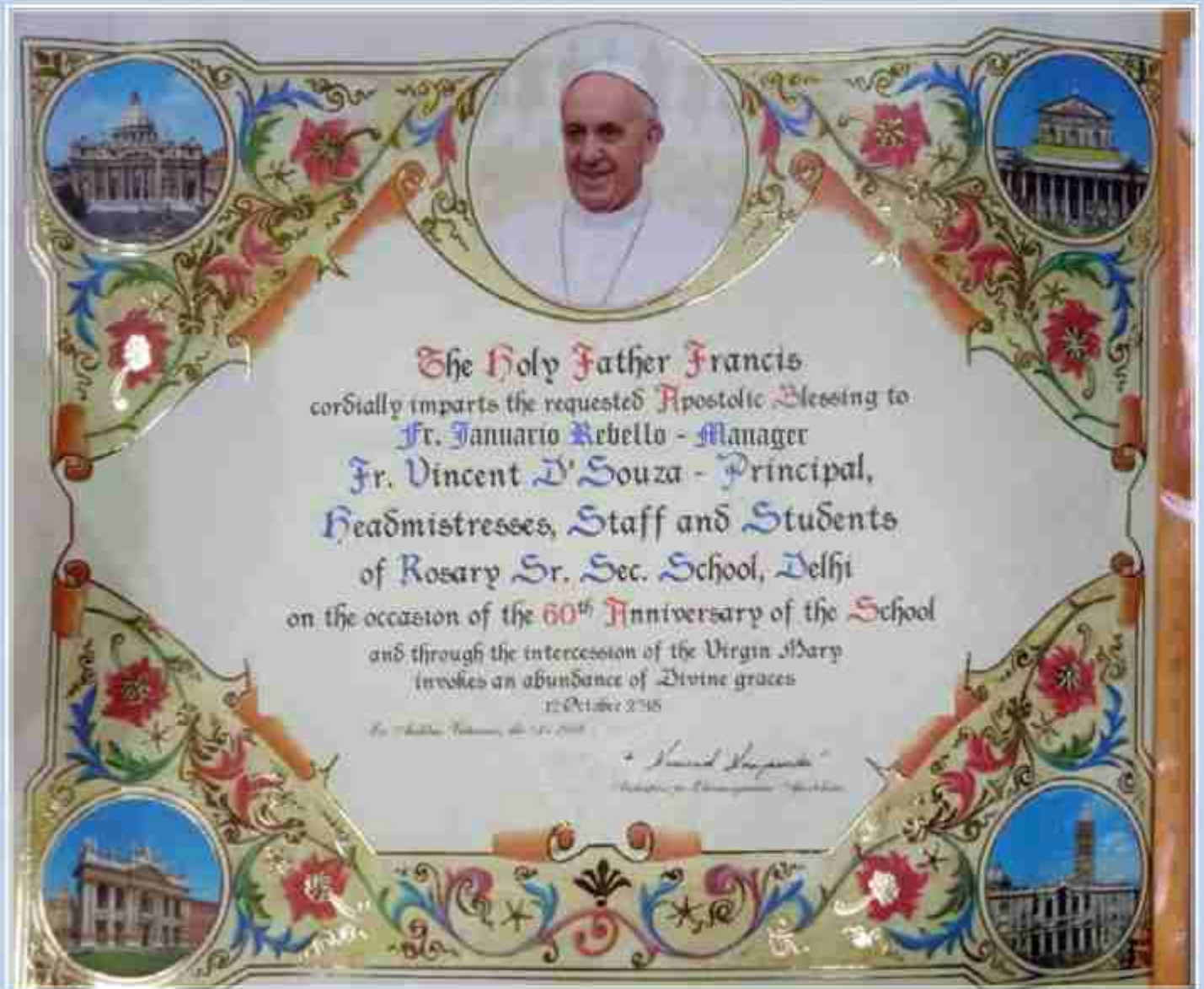

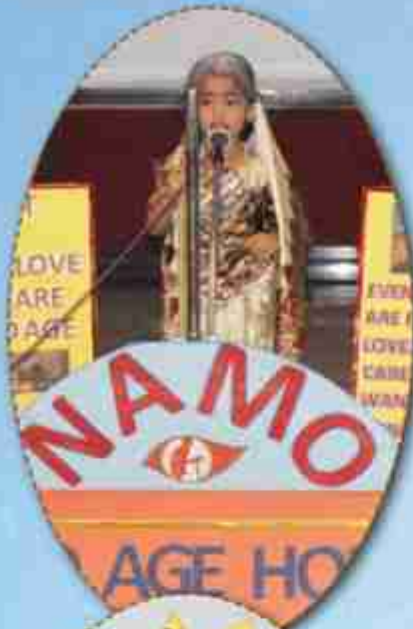

ROSARY SCHOOL 1958 to 2018

It has been a difficult task but all the same quite enjoyable to delve into antiquity and collect facts and dates from different sources and finally to present a picture of Rosary Sr. Sec. School, as it stands, now.

The history of 'Rosary School', as it is popularly known, dates back to 1932. It will be a pleasant surprise for most of us as we believe that it was founded in 1958. It was started as a primary school in the year 1932 and was known as the Mission School. Due to financial difficulties; and other problems the school was closed down after about four years and like the phoenix, the school had its rebirth, rising from its ashes. The school started functioning again from 1958 with a new name - Rosary School, with the help and encouragement of the late Archbishop Dr. Joseph Fernandes. Its first Principal was Rev. Fr. Jorge D'Souza and he remained in office for about five years. Nursery class, the only class at that time was held in the side wing of the church.

The area where the present senior school building stands was all by itself called Pompyabad. It was a marshy land, buffaloes and cattle used to graze there. Next to take charge as principal was Fr. George D'Mello. He was in the school for a short period.

The classes were upgraded to standard 2 and about 12 students were there in each class at that time. Fr. George Panakal took charge as principal in 1964. After getting permission from His Grace Bishop Joseph Fernandes, Fr. George went ahead with his progressive plans. The adjacent land was bought for the expansion of the school. He also got permission to upgrade one class every year. About 6 students managed to reach 5th standard. There is no exaggeration in saying that Fr. George Panakal has been the pillar and the main force to lay a strong foundation on which stands Rosary Sr. Sec. School. It is said that he literally went to each and every house in the adjoining areas requesting and persuading parents to send their children to Rosary School. It's because of his efforts that many parents showed faith in the school, and the strength of the School increased unabated. Consequently was felt the need for a spacious building. The foundation stone of the main building was laid with the blessing of His Grace Bishop Joseph Fernandes and inauguration of the building took place on 7th Oct, 1966 - The Feast Day of the school.

In the year 1970 the school was recognized and affiliated to CBSE. In January, the same year was started the IX std with Art subjects. In this age of science and technology it was felt that education cannot be complete without the teaching of science subjects. To prepare the school to begin the science stream the foundation stone for science block was laid by the most Rev. Dr. Angelo Ignatius Fernandes, the Archbishop of Delhi on 26th April, 1971. And thus came up the science block with three spacious well equipped laboratories for Biology, Physics and Chemistry.



In 1972 Nursery wing was shifted to Model Town in a rented building. Nursery and KG classes were conducted there.

In 1973 the first batch of students appeared for board exam and brought creditable results.

The school witnessed heavy floods in 1978. The complete ground floor of the main building and the Science Block were submerged in 10 feet deep waters resulting in the tragic destruction and irreparable loss of the prized library with 9,000 precious books and almost the total annihilation of the Chemistry lab. The Principal's office and the main office were in a mess. Ms. Prakash (Librarian) sailed by boat to reach the school to save the remaining books. With flood waters still knee deep many teachers and some students waded across and began mopping up the corridors and class rooms and setting up furniture that was left of any use. It was a herculean task to transform all this to its past glory.

In 1981 land for Primary Section was bought. In 1985 Fr. George Panakal was transferred. The next principal Fr. E.D. Sebastian took charge. He was a great visionary and took the school to further heights. It was during this time that the era of Information Technology began with a big bang. Rosary School was not to be left behind. To keep pace with time, well equipped Computer Section was set up and the Inauguration Ceremony took place on 1st August, 1987. It was in the tenure of Fr. Sebastian that the management took the decision to upgrade the school to the Senior Secondary level. Rev. Fr. E.D. Sebastian retired in 1990.

Father Joseph Kudilil (Former Vice Principal) joined the school as the Principal. Fr. Joseph was a man with innovative ideas and scientific temperament. He encouraged students to move beyond text book knowledge, and personally guided them in activities like Annual Day celebration, Sports Day celebration, Science Exhibition, Dramatics etc.

In 1990, during Fr. Joseph Kudilil's tenure, the school was upgraded the senior secondary level with the beginning of 11th and 12th standards. The school scaled new heights of achievements in the coming years.

Another mile stone in the history of the school was the completion of the Primary Section building. It was blessed by His Grace Most Reverend Alan de Lastic, the Archbishop of Delhi and inaugurated by the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Delhi Shri Madan Lal Khurana.

Father Joseph Kudilil was transferred in 1995 and Fr. Joseph Vadakumcherry took charge. Calm and composed Fr. Vadakumcherry devoted his attention to newer areas. Silent advisor of nature, he took the initiative of laying the lush green grass in all the grounds of the school. The present state of the school grounds is the result of his efforts. Under his auspices 'Eco Club' was formed in the school. The club at present is working almost like a movement.

Fr. Joseph Vadakumcherry retired in the year 2000 handing over the charge to the present principal Rev. Fr. Dr. A Alphonse. Fr. Dr. A Alphonse highly qualified with a PhD In 'Metal Pollution' is a man who has a passion for perfection. He is a great disciplinarian. His contribution to the development and progress of the school has been immense.



On the onset he has taken the school from anonymity and placed it on the map of Delhi Schools. The successful organization of Interschool events like Inter-School Basketball Tournament, Inter school Quiz- 'The Rosarian Quest' and Science and Commerce Symposium - 'The Rosarian Enlightenment' has helped the school to carve a niche for itself. With the growing strength of the students the need for further extension of the school was felt. And then began the construction of the extension' block to the primary building. The foundation stone of this block was laid on 19th August, 2002 and it was blessed and inaugurated on 29th July, 2003 by the Most Rev. Vincent M. Concessao, Archbishop of Delhi. The top floor of this block houses a spacious auditorium, a prized possession of the Rosarians.



The formation of social action club called 'The Good Samaritan Club', 'The Road Safety Club' are some other landmarks achieved by the school. Father Alphonse's initiation and inspiration made the school choir one of the best.

Rev. Fr. Dr. Sabu Joseph took over the reins of the school from Father Alphonse In the year 2007. The school scaled greater heights under the leadership of the energetic and dynamic Principal Father Sabu Joseph.

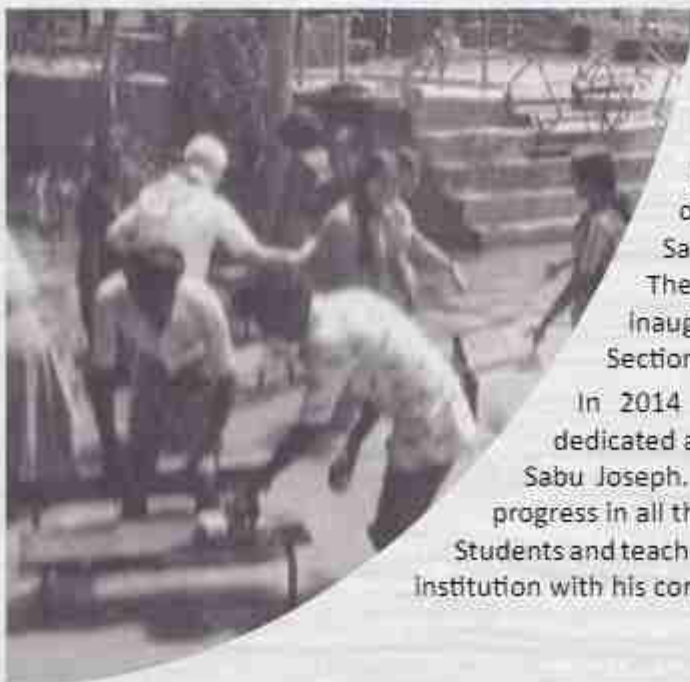
In 2011, Romilla Bhattacharjee of Std XI represented Delhi state at 62nd National Junior Championship and secured the 7th position. Aastha Sahni of Std X played Badminton at the National Level and secured 2nd position at All India Level.

In the year 2011 the new Administrative Block which is spacious and Impressive was inaugurated.

In 2012 Rosarians won the Peace Gong Trophy – 1st position at Children's Social Conclave. A joint initiative of the UN Volunteers. PIDT (Asia Regional Partner, YSA) Sachhet & Guru Rabindranath Tagore Foundation.

The Language Lab an initiative of Father Sabu Joseph was inaugurated in the year 2009. In the same year the Senior Section Auditorium was renovated to its present splendour.

In 2014 the present Principal Rev. Father Vincent D'Souza a dedicated and committed visionary took over the charge from Father Sabu Joseph. Under his leadership the school has made tremendous progress in all the fields. A prayer room in each wing was his first concern. Students and teachers visit these room regularly. We wish that he will bless this Institution with his continued service and the school will touch further heights.

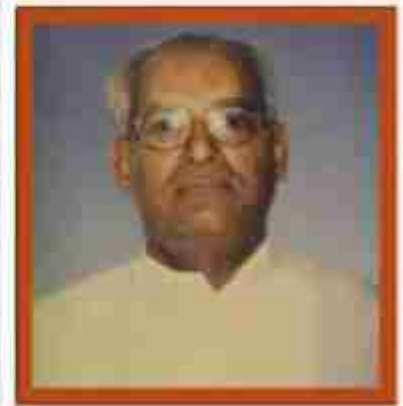

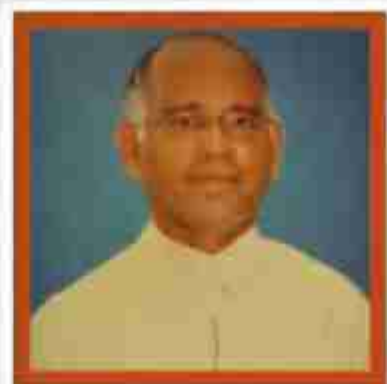

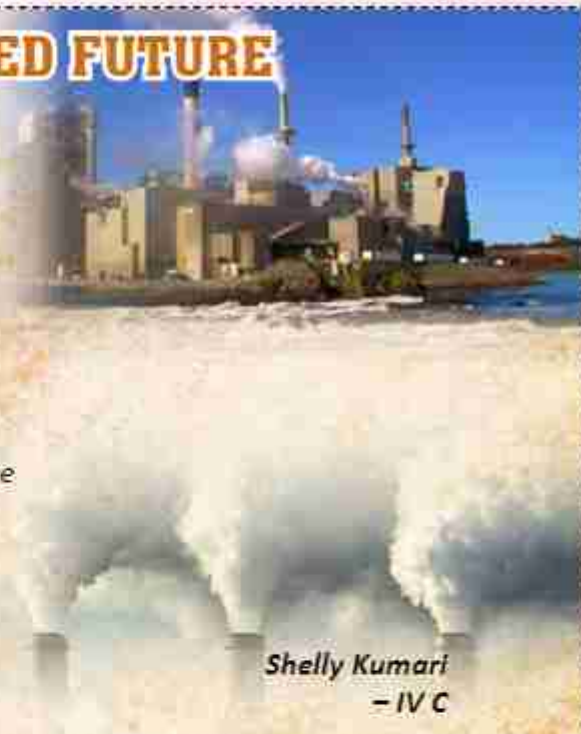

हिंदी भाषा के प्रचार-प्रसार की दिशा में आज हिंदी के व्यावहारिक पक्ष को प्रभावशाली रूप से कार्यरूप देने की आवश्यकता है। भारत की उन्नति राष्ट्रभाषा को अपनाने में ही हो सकती है। हमारा धर्म तथा कर्तव्य है कि हम उसको उन्नत स्थान दें। हमें स्वप्न में भी यह नहीं सोचना चाहिए कि विदेशी साहित्य को पढ़कर हम राष्ट्रीय भावना का विकास कर सकते हैं। हमारा कर्तव्य है कि हम दैनिक व्यवहार में अपनी राष्ट्रभाषा को प्रधानता दें। हमारा देश तभी पूर्ण रूप से स्वतंत्र होगा जब हमारी राष्ट्रभाषा का केवल भारत में ही नहीं बल्कि पूरे विश्व में प्रचार हो, आदर हो।

PEN IS MIGHTIER THAN THE SWORD

Even now the U.S.A. the U.S.S.R. and Germany are called the 'mightiest' powers of the present world. And the sword or military strength is at the root of all the 'mightiest'. In Contrast to this, the pen is a very humble instrument. So, to say that the pen is mightier than the sword may seem an impossible statement.

Still the proverb, like all other proverbs, states a very simple truth. Here the words 'pen' and the 'sword' stand for the 'writer' and the 'soldier'. The proverb, therefore, means that writers and thinkers exercise a much greater influence—wider and more enduring—on men and the world than any military conqueror. Let us take up the greatest generals of the past. But the empires they built up were limited. And even these limited empires passed away almost with their death. But Aristotle, Socrates, Plato, Homer & Dante still rule the mind of men everywhere. Our own country too had many mighty emperors. They and their empires are all gone; but Valmiki and Kalidas sway our minds yet. Rabindranath's empire has been extending to distant corners of the Earth.

In the military sense too writers sometimes exercise a greater and a wider influence than a general. Let us take writers like Rousseau, Voltaire, and Karl Marx. Their writings inspired revolutions in France and Russia.



Human civilization is going through a huge crisis. There is a mad race for deadly weapons to annihilate mankind. In times like these, man's only hope lies in firm faith in the truth of the proverb - "pen is mightier than the sword". It will make humans leave the ways of violence and take to ways of freedom.

Should Hair Dyes be used?

A E U S T A C H I A N T U B E

Many women and men see their hair as an important aspect of their physical appearance—a fact deeply reflected in hair dye's continued popularity. While this isn't inherently a bad thing, the more we learn about chemical based dyes, the more we realize that exposing our bodies to these toxins is counterproductive to living a healthy life.

SOME INTERESTING FACTS ON HAIR DYES:

- 1) Natural hair dyes originated from plants in 1600s (like henna).
- 2) The French chemist Eugene Schuler invented the first synthetic hair dye using a new chemical called paraphenylenediamine. He started selling these and founded the famous L'Oréal Company.
- 3) Hydrogen peroxide and ammonia are used to prepare hair dyes. Together they are responsible to lighten the natural hair colour. Hair dyes also contain phenols and aromatic amines.
- 4) Hair dyes contain over 5000 chemicals.
- 5) Chronic exposure to hair dyes increases the risk of developing rheumatoid arthritis, which causes intense swelling between joints.
- 6) These chemicals can cause methemoglobinemia, a discoloration.
- 7) You all must be thinking that bright and light colours would cause the most harm but it is exactly the opposite. The darker the hair dye the more dangerous it is due to presence of lead acetate.
- 8) Colouring hair elevates the risk of developing lymphoma (cancer)
- 9) It is recommended that one shouldn't shampoo immediately before colouring as this will remove the natural oils that protect your scalp during the colouring process.
- 10) Hair dyes also trigger asthma,

So, one should try to avoid using such chemicals for sure. Hair dyes help you to elevate your status in the society but one should always embrace and respect oneself because health is greater than everything.
